Located on 27,000 acres (twice the size of Manhattan!), the campus rivers flow through, has nesting eagles (they have their own webcam so you can watch the baby eagles hatch!) and 88 miles of trails. As a bonus it is not unusual to see deer roaming throughout the campus. Beautiful buildings, landscape and gardens.



Directions: From Atlanta: Travel north on I-75. Take Exit 285 for Red Top Mtn Rd. Turn right onto US 41. Continue on US 41 to US 411/GA-20 W, keep right. Keep right at fork, follow signs for US 27/GA-53/GA-20/Rome. Turn left onto E 9th St SE. Turn right onto E 2nd Ave. Slight left onto N 2nd Ave NW. Slight left onto Shorter Ave. Turn left into Park. From Birmingham: Travel north on I-59 toward Gadsden. Take exit 182 for I-759 toward Gadsden. Take exit 4B for US-411 and merge onto N Rainbow Dr. Left onto AL-68 E/Cedar Bluff Rd. Continue straight to stay on AL-9N Continue straight onto Shorter Ave. Turn right, then left into Park.

From Chattanooga: Take I-24 to exit 185A for I-75S. Take exit 348 for GA-151. Turn right onto GA-151S. Left onto GA-136E. Turn right onto Turner McCall Blvd NW. Turn left, then left to Park.
